## Jennifer Cárcamo

Jennifer Cárcamo is a Salvadoran independent filmmaker, scholar, and organizer. She is a PhD Candidate in the UCLA History Department and a Visiting Scholar at Rutgers University's Center for Latin American Studies (CLAS). She is a social movement historian with a special interest in the contemporary transnational history of mass organizations and political movements within, across, and outside of Central America/Mesoamerica. Her dissertation focuses on the origins and evolution of communist parties and socialist movements in Central America from 1920-1960. As a result, over the past three years she has successfully conducted archival research in Cuba, Mexico, Russia, El Salvador, and Guatemala with the generous support of various academic institutions.

Ignacio Carvajal is a scholar, poet, translator, and Assistant Professor in the Department of Literature at UC San Diego. Their research interests include Indigenous responses to colonialism and evangelization during the early colonial period; pedagogical approaches to Indigenous language learning (especially K'iche'); Central American literatures and cultures; Poetry; and Translation. He is the author of the poetry collections *Plegarias* (University of Houston / El Suriporfiado 2019) and *allow* (La Resistencia Press 2021) and obtained a PhD in Latin American Literatures and Cultures from the University of Texas at Austin.
